The after-school program is a safe and supportive space for all children. This year, we continued to offer our homework support program with 13 club choices that focused on educational development, physical fitness and the arts. A new kindergarten-aged group was introduced as well, helping the children integrate from school life to after-school life.

Thanks to the generous funding of the Jumpstart Community grant, we were able to provide 282 hours of gym activities that helped enhance our members' physical literacy skills.

Through Kid Tech Nation, we were able to educate children in digital literacy and offer programming on Saturdays. Pink shirt day continues to be an important staple in our program, and we will continue to advocate for all children's rights every day.

Thank you to Erin Sports, One Magic Moment, Old Navy and Gap for creating memorable holiday moments for our families. Their generosity helps put smiles on many of our members' faces.

Partnership with the Montreal Canadiens Children's Foundation enabled us to bring our "Know Better Play Better" project to fruition. This partnership helped connect us to one of our biggest fans, Tomas Tatar. Tomas has given his time to the centre, encouraging members to achieve their personal goals.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

2019-2020 proved to be another exciting year for our youth!
Dawson was chosen amongst 10 communities across Canada by
Bell, NBA and BGCC and received two basketball backboards,
new nets, and rims - an in-kind gift worth more than \$10,000! Our
youth members and staff were also so excited to be featured in
the Bell's Backboard Project video.

In addition to social, recreational, and educational activities for pre-teens, teens, and young adults, our young people are learning to become advocates and take on leadership roles. As proud representatives of Dawson Boys & Girl Club and the City of Montreal, our Youth Council co-hosted Express Yourself 2019, a National Youth Forum at Concordia University. They were empowered and given the opportunity to lead various workshops. They shared their experiences and ideas with more than 100 teenagers from across Canada. Youth Council member Davon Scott was selected to be the Quebec Youth Representative for the Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada National Youth Council 2019–2021.

Our staff also received extensive training in leadership, planning, teamwork, behavior management and safety through the Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada e-learning portal.

Gabrielle Roddy's open-gym and stretching-yoga classes are now at capacity thanks to her expertise, passion for teaching, creativity and capacity to adapt programs to many different levels and needs. This past year she offered three fall prevention workshops with 20 participants.

The reading and discussion group offered in partnership with the Thomas More Institute celebrated 7 years at Dawson. We are thankful for our two passionate animators, Murray Shugar and Jennifer Anstead who have made this such a success. The group reached its capacity of 12 in the fall of 2019.



FOOD + SUSTAINABILITY

Food and Sustainability had its debut to Dawson programs as a new department in April of 2019. The department is home to four distinct programs. The focus is to ensure our members and the community at large have access to fresh and healthy food, to offer educational workshops related to growing and cooking food from scratch, and to advocate and teach how to diminish our ecological footprint.











DAWSON KITCHEN

Headed by our chef, Michelle MacGregor, the Dawson kitchen prepared fresh and healthy snacks and light meals for all our members and provided three-course community lunches every Tuesday.

Our activities included: P'tits Chefs (tots 3-5 years), Kid Food Nation (children 7-12 years), Community Lunches, and special events.

MOBILE MARKETS

Mobile Markets were created to sell fresh and affordable fruit and vegetables on-site in a number of social housing units across Verdun.

The goal is to ensure elderly residents with mobility issues have access to produce. Dawson expanded this offer by including a mini-market held at the same time as our community lunch at our centre.

UN PLANT DE TOMATE À LA FOIS

Led by Julie Langlois, Dawson's urban agriculture initiative brings hands-on gardening to citizens throughout the community.

This past year we offered horticultural workshops in schools, daycares, and day camps.

MANNA FOOD BANK

Founded in 1985, Manna was integrated into Dawson's programming in November of 2019. Spearheaded by Joseph Quinn, Susan Mooney, and George O'Reilly, the food bank was added to the Food and Sustainability department and distributes food baskets to Verdun's vulnerable population.


